## **Executive Director's Report**

#### A. HR/Personnel

- 1. 1. As of the July 4 pay date, NWCSRA part time staff have worked 25,499 hours, earned 637 PLAWA hours, and used 107 hours. (17%)
- 2. In person interviews for the Program Coordinator position will begin at the beginning of August and will be scheduled after phone interviews in July.

## B. Recreation

 Inclusion service hours are reflected below. Budgeted inclusion dollars per member agency is calculated at 3% of each member agency's contribution. According to our member agreement, when the budgeted dollars have been used, NWCSRA will bill back the member agency for companion support hours. For our member districts, summer programming uses the most inclusion hours, followed by preschool, and before and after school care.

Below are the current inclusion costs per member district, as of 7/14/2025.




