Out of district residents may participate in all programs; however, the non-resident fee will be charged.

Lincolnway Special Recreation Association Residents

NWCSRA and Lincolnway Special Recreation Association (LWSRA) have an agreement that offers programs to the other association's residents at the resident rates, with the following exceptions:

- 1. Special Services such as scholarships, door-to-door transportation and first-time participant discounts are not included.
- 2. Adult Day Program, day camps, vacation trips, away camps and weekend (overnight) trips are excluded, however, individuals may still register at non-resident rates.
- 3. Early bird or other discounts do not apply under this agreement. Registration priority may be given to the home association's residents first.
- 4. When programs are offered free to either association's own residents, the program or event will be offered to residents of the other association at the regular fee for residents.
- 5. If both agencies offer the same or similar program, non-residents may register at the non-resident price.

Transportation Guidelines

Transportation times and locations will be determined based on enrollment at the time of the registration deadline. A minimum number of participants is required at any site in order to offer transportation. Staff will confirm transportation information with those who have registered prior to the start of the program.

Program Guidelines

- Northern Will County Special Recreation Association provides sufficient staff to participant ratio to ensure a safe and meaningful recreation experience.
- When arriving and departing a program, parents/guardians are required to "check in" with a program staff.
- Participants will only be released to designated individuals approved by parents/guardians. Any changes to a participant's approved list must be updated in your online account.
- Participants will not be released to depart from or wait unattended after any program without prior approval and a signed waiver.
- NWCSRA staff will not be responsible for participants arriving prior to the scheduled program time.
- NWCSRA reserves the right to cancel a program or event due to insufficient enrollment.

Behavior Expectations

Northern Will County Special Recreation Association encourages and promotes the concept of fun for everyone. Certain rules and guidelines have been established to ensure the safety and enjoyment for everyone. Participants, staff, volunteers and parents/ guardians are expected to exhibit appropriate behavior at all times. Additional rules may be developed for particular programs and athletic leagues as deemed necessary by staff. All parties shall:

- Show respect to all participants, staff, volunteers and parents.
- Abstain from using abusive or foul language.
- Refrain from causing bodily harm to others.
- Demonstrate respect to equipment, supplies uniforms and facilities.
- Represent NWCSRA in a manner that is consistent with the goals, objectives and ethics of the association.

Individual behavior plans may be developed on the advice of parents/guardians, staff members or other professionals. NWCSRA reserves the right to pause participation or dismiss any individual if the above procedures are not adhered to. Each situation will be evaluated individually and on its own merit.

Participant Wellness Guidelines

To prevent the spread of contagious illnesses, participants should not attend programs when any of the following symptoms exist:

- · Fever of 100° or higher
- Vomiting or diarrhea within the last 24 hours
- Contagious rash or a rash of unknown origin
- · Persistent cough and/or cold symptoms
- "Pink eye" (conjunctivitis) or discharge from the eye
- Symptoms of mumps, measles, chicken pox, strep throat, flu, impetigo, coxsackie virus, head lice, mites and ringworm or coronavirus
- · Runny nose with yellow or green discharge

Please notify the NWCSRA office if the participant contracts any contagious illness that will affect his/her attendance at the program. Participants should return to programs at the recommendation of their doctor, or, if not under a doctor's care, when the symptoms have clearly passed.

Program Cancellations Due To Weather

Cancellation of a program or transportation is possible if conditions are considered unsafe.

 Three hours prior to the starting time of the program or transportation route, NWCSRA will determine if the program should be cancelled due to weather. You will be contacted ONLY if the program is cancelled. The program may or may not be rescheduled.

Late Pick-Up

Participants must be picked up at the designated time listed in the program guide, flyer, email or verbally informed by staff.

- There will be a \$20 fee for parents/guardians who are 15 minutes late to pick up their son/daughter from a program. An additional \$20 will be charged for every hour past the ending time of the program.
- Payment is due at the time of pick up or prior to the next program for which the participant is registered. If payment is not received, the participant will not be allowed to attend the next program until the late fee is paid.

Personal Items

NWCSRA discourages bringing unnecessary personal items to programs. Staff are not responsible for lost, damaged or stolen items. Lost & found is located at the NWCSRA office.

- 1. Log into your Amilia account.
- 2. View program content (use search to assist) and sign up for the program(s) you want.
- Residents of NWCSRA member agencies will receive a discount off the posted non-resident price, which equals the resident price when you register for the program.
- 4. Payment must accompany registration.
- 5. Accepted forms of payment include eChecks or credit cards (Mastercard, Visa, Discover, or American Express).
- 6. Receive your confirmation via email. If it does not reach your inbox, check spam/junk folder.

Mail & Walk In Registration Procedures

- 1. Create an online Amilia account if you don't have one.
- 2. Review brochure program information and select program(s) you want.
- 3. Complete registration form in brochure or on website.
- 4. Payment must accompany Registration Form.
- 5. Cash, check or credit cards accepted.

Important Information for All Registrants

- Registrations must be received at the NWCSRA office by deadline date of each individual program.
- Registration is considered complete when full payment is received.
- Phone-in registrations will not be accepted and will not "hold your place" on a roster.
- NWCSRA staff may not receive payment or registrations during programs.
- No prorated fees for late registration. Only exception is if the participant is new to NWCSRA programs.
- All outstanding registration fees must be paid in full prior to registering for the next program season.
- NWCSRA must have a signed registration form in order for staff to process any registration.



Scholarships

NWCSRA and its member agencies are committed to providing all residents the opportunity to participate in NWCSRA programs. A scholarship fund has been developed to assist individuals who may be experiencing financial difficulty. Refund Procedures

- Requests for refunds or credits must be requested ten business days prior to beginning of the program. Programs with daily admissions or tickets will be a prorated refund based on budgetary considerations.
- Full or prorated refund will be granted if a medical condition prohibits participation. Doctor's note must be provided.
